Introduction

The IB works with universities in nearly 140 countries to promote broader recognition of the Diploma Programme for the 120,000 Diploma Programme graduates entering university each year.

Since 1983, the IB has been recognized by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU) as an entry qualification (equivalent to + 2 qualification of an Indian Board) to all universities in India. The IB is committed to supporting the large proportion of students who wish to remain in India for their undergraduate studies and to creating pathways to enable more students (including NRIs) to consider this option.

The aim of this booklet is to give you an overview of University recognition in India with statements and website links of universities in India with updated polices. This is a guide for all stakeholders to understand the recognition landscape in India. As higher education institutions in India respond to the growth of the IB, this booklet will be updated on a regular basis.




Global Programme Distribution

In the Asia Pacific region, there are 460 schools in 28 countries offering one of the three IB programmes: 327 schools offer the Diploma Programme (DP); 110 schools offer the Middle Years Programme (MYP), and 205 schools offer the Primary Years Programme (PYP). Distribution of the three programmes in the 28 countries in Asia Pacific is listed below (table 1).

There are 76 IB World Schools in India offering one or more of the three IB programmes. 25 schools offer the Primary Years Programme, 8 schools offer the Middle Years Programme and 70 schools offer the Diploma Programme. The first school was authorized in 1976.

Chart 1Distribution of IB programmes in Asia Pacific May 2010






Asia Pacific IB Diploma Programme Growth

The total number of students who were registered for the IB Diploma in May 2010 was 105,000 around the world. Student registration in the IB diploma programme has grown at approximately 20% per year in the Asia Pacific region. This trend looks set to continue in the Asia Pacific context.

IB Asia Pacific Diploma Candidate Growth






Global Indian Students Enrolment 2010

Over 12,000 Indian students have completed the IB diploma in the past twenty years. The Diploma programme in India has grown substantially, particularly in the last 5 years when the number of students participating in the programme in India has grown over 20% each year, doubling in student enrolment since 2005. In 2011, over 1700 Indian passport holders enrolled for the IB diploma programme. The growth of Indian students is depicted below:

Chart 3Diploma candidate growth since 1999 for Indian students






Transcript request data for India diploma candidates

In May 2010, 3,861 Indian students requested transcript requests for the purpose of university admissions. The transcript requests were made in various countries (mainly US, Canada, UK and India) (chart 4)

Overview of higher education in India

In India the central government is responsible for major policy relating to higher education in the country. It provides grants to University Grants Commission (UGC) and establishes central universities in the country. The Central Government is also responsible for declaration of Education Institutions as 'Deemed to be University' on the recommendation of the UGC. There are 39 Central Universities under the purview of the Ministry of Human Resource Development, 251 State universities and 130 Deemed to be universities. The Central and State universities have faculties, academic departments, affiliated colleges, post graduate centers, and other recognized institutes under them.

Entry to undergraduate courses is based on the performance in Class 12 examination and or Entrance test. Most of the professional institutes in India today prefer to conduct entrance exams for selecting candidates. The entrance tests are in the month of April/May or June. While some institutes participate in a common entrance exam, others may conduct their own individual entrance exams.

Engineering:

Technical education plays a vital role in human resource development of the country; there are 65 technical institutions in India, which include 15 Indian Institute of Technology (IIT's), 20 National Institute of Technology amongst others.

Entrance to Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) is conducted through the Joint Entrance Examination (JEE). Besides JEE, there are other engineering entrance exams as well. The All India Engineering Entrance Examination (AIEEE) caters to the needs of the 18 National Institutes of Technology, alongside some other prominent engineering colleges.

Medicine:

There are different competitive exams for medicine; one of them is All India Pre-Medical/Pre-Dental Entrance Examination (AIPMT) for entry into Medical/Dental Colleges of India.

<u>Other professional courses:</u> Law, Hotel Management, and Bachelor of Business Administration also have the entrance test.

Please note: This is not an all comprehensive list, instead an attempt to give an overview of higher education in India.



Accreditation

National Assessment and Accreditation Council, was established by the University Grants Commission to evaluate the quality of higher education in India. In addition to that, Professional councils are responsible for recognition of courses, promotion of professional institutions and providing grants to undergraduate programmes and various awards. There are 15 professional councils in India including All India Council of Technical Education (AICTE) which recognizes technical education in India and Medical Council of India (MCI) recognizes Medical education in India amongst others. Before enrolling for a professional course, students must check if the institute has the relevant accreditation.

Evaluation of Foreign Degrees

The Association of Indian Universities is a society which promotes university activities. The Evaluation division of AIU is responsible for the work relating to equivalence of degrees/certificates awarded by the accredited foreign universities/educational institutions. The Division also provides information to foreign students to facilitate their admission in Universities/other educational Institutions in the country.



Recognition of the IB Diploma Programme in India

Since 1983 International Baccalaureate Diploma has been recognized by the Association of Indian universities as an entry qualification to all universities in India. The IBO produces and issues for universities a document detailing percentage equivalency along with the transcript of results. To request this service, students must notify their Diploma Programme (DP) coordinator of their intention to gain entrance into an Indian university. The coordinator will then submit the request using the "Request for Results" service on IBIS (secured website for IB coordinators).

Students, particularly those applying for entrance to professional courses, can either apply to the AIU upon release of their results, specifying what professional courses they are applying for, or apply directly to the eligibility department of the university they wish to attend.

Admission to most university courses is based on the academic achievement in Class 12 or entrance test. Entry requirements vary from university to university and course to course. Prior to commencing the DP, students and parents must be familiar with the required subject combinations and levels for the student's future career path; this should ensure students' eligibility for particular professional courses. A student interested in studying an undergraduate course must make direct contact with the college or university he or she would like to attend to check specific course and entry requirements.



Checklist of Application Package to be given to students seeking admission to colleges in INDIA

- A letter from the IB Coordinator/Principal or College Counselor stating the date for the release of results requesting them to accept the application on Predicted grades and past performance.
- Recognition statement from Association of Indian Universities (AIU)
- Transcripts including past performance in Grade 10 & 11, predicted grades from the school and percentage equivalence.
- Grades to Percentage Equivalence document from IBO
- Copy of the University Recognition statement from the website or hardcopy if available
- Character Certificate
- Transfer certificate from School
- Migration Certificate and South Asian Transcript from IBO, when available.



Dear Mr. Slackburn.



Thank you for your letter of 10 August 1983 alongwith a copy of IBO Handbook.

I have seen the tearsheet from the IED handbook and find it in order except that the names of the Universities(Ajmer Medical School, Delhi; Hyderabad; Karnatak; Mysore) may not be produced. As the decisions on equivalence are taken by the Equivalence Committee consisting of Vice-Chancellors, the executives heads of universities, we have not come across a case where AIU opinion although advisory is not accepted.

The IS Diploma is generally accepted by most of the universities, at par, with +2 stage qualifications as recommended by the AIU. The students who intend to join the universities in this country after completion of their IS qualifications may not find any difficulty for assessments of their academic attainments. They are welcome to seek our assistance in case of difficulty.

We had suggested to Mr. Robert Creighton that the students who intend to join universities in this country might be given a copy of the following resolution adopted by the AIU:

"Resolved that the International Baccalaureate Diploma Examination awarded by the International Baccalaureate Office, Geneva, Switzerland be recognised as equialent to a pass in the +2 stage of the new pattern of education (10+2)."

This has reference to your request dated 10th November, 2010 seeking clarification on the recognition of IB Diploma.

In this connection we would like to inform you that "International Baccalaureate Diploma" awarded by the International Baccalaureate Organization, Geneva, Switzerland, has been equated with +2 stage (Grade 12) qualification of an Indian Board since 1983.

Students intending to join Indian Universities after completion of their IB qualifications are eligible to pursue Bachelor's degree programme at Indian Universities.

Those intending to join Professional Degree programmes at Indian Universities viz. medicine/engineering etc. are required to have studied the subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology/Mathematics and English at the qualifying level.

Students after obtaining their IB Diploma can obtain an Equivalence Certificate from this office which is issued on a remittance of equivalent amount of US \$ 200, in Indian currency, in the form of Demand Draft only, favouring the 'ASSOCIATION OF INDIAN UNIVERSITIES', payable at the New Delhi branch of the issuing bank.



- 3.3.2. Senior School Certificate of various Boards recognized by Association of Indian Universities / Central Board of Secondary Education, be considered as equivalent to the Senior School Certificate of Central Board for purposes of eligibility to various Undergraduate Courses.
- 3.3.3. Students who pass various Degree / School Examination of Foreign Universities / Boards as have already been approved by the Equivalence Committee, from time to time, be considered eligible as a matter of routine.

The cases of only those candidates who do not fall in the list of Association of Indian Universities / University Grants Commission/ Ministry of Human Resource Development recognized accredited Boards / Universities shall be referred to the University on the basis of individual merit.

3.3.5. Provisional admission for IB Students

Relevant Extracts from the Minutes of the Equivalence Committee Meeting held on 21.6.2004

The Committee considered the issue of equivalence to convert grade point average of the diploma awarded by the International Baccalaureate Organisation, Geneva, Switzerland and percentage of marks awarded in the Senior School Certificate Examination of the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi, for purpose of admission to different courses in the University. The Committee noted that the 1B Diploma is already approved as being equivalent to 10+2 level school leaving certificate by the University of Delhi

The Committee also felt that in order to alleviate the hardship being faced by students seeking admission in 2004, the equivalence forumla issued and certified the institution last attended by the student, may be accepted on a provisional basis for granting admission by all colleges. In such cases, the principle for calculating the equivalent makrs on a scale of 1 to 100, the mid point of the range indicated for a particular grade awarded by the International Baccalaureate Organisation shall be taken as the equivalent marks. For example, where grade 6 has been shown to be equivalent to the range 89 to 95, the marks equivalent shall be taken as the midpoint which is 92.5. Similarly, for a grade of 5 where the range has been indicated as 83 to 88, the equivalent shall be 85.5.





The University of Mumbai accepts IB students with Predicted grades. Due to the late release date of the final results from the I.B. office in Geneva, Switzerland, students are eligible to apply on the basis of their provisional grades issued by their respective schools.

Re: Eligibility – cum - Enrolment of the students admitted on the basis of Provisional Statement of Eligibility issued by this office for the academic year 2009 – 2010.

The Directors / Heads of University Departments, Principals of affiliated Colleges, Heads of recognised Post-graduate Institutions and the Director, Institute of Distance Education are hereby requested to collect Eligibility – cum – enrolment form from the students who have joined their respective Colleges / Departments / Institutes on the basis of Provisional Statement of Eligibility issued to them by the University during the academic year 2009-2010.

They are requested to collect eligibility — cum — enrolment fee at the rate of Rs.200/- (Rupees Two Hundred Only) Plus Rs.20/- (Rupees Twenty Only) per student towards the price of enrolment form (Total Rs.220/-). The price of form should be shown separately in the challan and deposit the same in the Bank of Baroda Extension Counter, M.J. Phule Bhavan, Vidyanagari, Kalina, Santacruz (East), Mumbai — 400 098 under the Budget Head 'ENROLMENT' 2008. The Eligibility —cum—Enrolment forms should be forwarded to this office duly signed by the Directors/Heads of the Department/Principals of the affiliated colleges alongwith a photo copy of Provisional Statement of Eligibility and also list of the respective students in duplicate duly certified by the Principals/Director/Head of the Colleges / Departments / Institutes.

The Eligibility-cum-Enrolment forms and list of the students should reach this office within a week from the receipt of Eligibility Certificate, with a covering letter mentioning therein the number and date of the challan under which the amount of the fee has been deposited in the Bank of Baroda. Please ignore this circular, if you have already submitted the Eligibility-cum-Enrolment forms alongwith necessary fees. Further, they are also requested to send xerox copy of Eligibility-cum-Enrolment Fee receipt while forwarding the confirmation of eligibility cases to enable this Unit to expedite the process of confirmation.

The admission be given strictly as per the provisions of the relevant ordinances. The appropriate instructions be given to the staff members dealing with the admission & eligibility related issues. In case of any doubts or query's concerning with the eligibility at that point of time the concerned staff member be asked to contact the Eligibility Section for assistance and to get the query's clarification.

Further, their attention is invited to this office circular No.Elg/C/5411 of 2009, dated 8th May, 2009 in the matter of accepting predicted grades and extending the facility to the students those who have passed higher level standard levels Examination conducted by the International Baccalaureate (I.B.) and "O" Levels/ "AS" Level/ "A" Level Examination conducted by the Cambridge International School (CIS). Since, the said qualifications have been considered eligible for the admission to first year degree course in the affiliated colleges of this University its Departments. Those principals of the affiliated colleges and Directors/Head of the University Departments who have admitted such students are requested to forward the attested xerox copy of final year marksheet issued to them by the International Baccalaureate / Cambridge International School to this office for taking necessary action.

They are also requested not to admit the student for the various courses without obtaining a proper provisional statement of eligibility certificate as per the provision made under Ordinance 111 of the University. The Ordinance 111 is reproduced below.

A student from another University or Board of Secondary or O.111 :-Intermediate Education or any other Statutory examining body seeking admission to the University shall apply to the Registrar for a statement of eligibility and except in the case of students from the Universities in the State of Maharashtra, who shall be required to pay fee of Rs.200/- only and for out of Maharashtra State pay a fee of Rs.300/- (Fee for the foreign Nationals is Rs.730/-). The Registrar may issue a provisional statement of eligibility if he is satisfied that the applicant is prima facie eligible for admission to this University. On production of such a provisional statement of eligibility, a student may seek provisional admission to this University at his own risk and on condition that he submits to the Registrar's office through the Head/Principal of his Institution/College, the necessary certificates in original together with a typed copy of each for confirmation of his eligibility before the close of the academic term in which the student is provisionally admitted to the University. No student from another University shall be admitted to any Institution maintained by or affiliated to the University except on production of a provisional statement of eligibility issued by the Registrar.

They are further, requested to quote this Ordinance Resolution of the Management Council in the prospectus of the college / institute for reference of the students.

In this connection, their attention is also invited to the Resolution passed by the Management Council at its' meeting held on 16th October, 2007 and 1st September, 2008, which is reproduced below:

Item No.9: After due deliberation, it was resolved that the proposal for issuing the provisional statement of Eligibility to the students by imposing a penalty after due date prescribed for the respective year on the affiliated colleges/recognized institutes of Rs.5,000/- and Rs.10,000/- for Non-Professional and Professional courses respectively be accepted. However, the said penalty shall be made effective from 1st October, 2007 till further orders, subject to the fulfillment of conditions as laid down in the Ordinances 119 & 120 relating to the attendance to be kept by the students and also subject to the condition that the student is admitted as per the admission schedule of the University.



I am writing in response to your mail of December 7, 2010. We would be happy to consider the IB Diploma Examination to be equivalent to the II PUC/12th standard examination for the purpose of admission to our undergraduate programme. However, please note that this programme is at present open only to students holding Indian passports and they have to qualify for admission through a national examination such as KVPY, IIT-JEE, AIREE and AIPMT. If a student is selected for admission and the results of the final examination are not available at the time of counseling (third week of June 2011), his/her admission will be provisional. When classes start in the first week of August 2011, the student will have to produce a marks card that confirms that he/she has studied Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics as main subjects and received a first class (60%) or equivalent grade in the final examination.
